General matters

TEMP – Temporary activities

Objectives

TEMP-O1 Enabling temporary events [DP, RCP]

A wide range of temporary events occur in Whakatū Nelson that support community well-being.

Policies

TEMP-P1 Benefits of temporary events [DP, RCP]

Recognise that temporary events provide social, cultural and economic benefits for the community.

TEMP-P2 Compatibility with surrounding environment [DP, RCP]

Provide for temporary events where their scale, location, nature and duration are compatible with the surrounding environment.

TEMP-P3 Large-scale temporary events [DP, RCP]

Manage the adverse effects of larger-scale temporary events by limiting their location, duration and frequency.

TEMP-P4 Considerations for management of temporary events [DP, RCP]

In managing the effects of temporary events, have particular regard to the extent to which:

1. measures are necessary to ensure noise associated with temporary events is not excessive or unreasonable for the given context;
2. access, vehicle traffic and parking are provided for and managed;
3. buildings and other structures associated with temporary events minimise adverse effects on amenity; and
4. tolerance for some effects may be greater given the impermanent nature of the activity, or be lower for more sensitive receiving environments.

Rules

Rule interpretation and application

TEMP-R1 [DP]

The rules that **apply** to temporary events are contained in the activity status table as follows:

1. TEMP-R4 to TEMP-R6

TEMP-R2 [DP]

The activity status tables and standards in the following chapters also **apply** to temporary events:

1. EW – Earthworks; and
2. SIGN – Signs; and
3. LIGHT – Light.

TEMP-R3 [DP]

The activity status tables and standards in the following chapters **do not apply** to temporary events unless otherwise specified in rules TEMP-R5 to TEMP-R7 below:

1. NOISE – Noise; and
2. SIGN – Signs; and
3. Part 4 – Area specific matters – all chapters:
 - a. GRZ – General residential zone; and
 - b. MRZ – Medium density residential zone; and
 - c. GRUZ – General rural zone; and
 - d. RLZ – Rural lifestyle zone; and
 - e. NCZ – Neighbourhood centre zone; and
 - f. LCZ – Local centre zone; and
 - g. MUZ – Mixed use zone; and
 - h. CCZ – City centre zone; and
 - i. LIZ – Light industrial zone; and
 - j. GIZ – General industrial zone; and
 - k. NOSZ – Natural open space zone; and
 - l. OSZ – Open space zone; and
 - m. SARZ – Sport and active recreation zone; and
 - n. HOSZ – Hospital zone; and
 - o. PORTZ – Port zone; and
 - p. PREC17 – Marina precinct; and

q. DEV2 – Saxton development area.
