"It's great to see people being creative with how they store their wood, and also making sure their wood shed has good air flow and keeps the rain off so that the wood keeps on drying while it is stored."


Cllr McGurk commented on the winners.

IT'S TIME TO CHECK YOUR CHIMNEY

We've still got a few months of warm weather to go but winter has a habit of sneaking up on us, so don't leave it too late to get your flue cleaned and wood burner checked by a professional chimney sweep.

Smoke from a woodburner is made up of gas and chemicals released by the wood as it burns. If the fire is too cool, due to damp wood or putting too much wood on the fire at once, residues don't burn and can build up on the inside of the chimney. Build-up like this will narrow your flue so it doesn't draw as well, make your wood burner less efficient, and could cause a chimney fire if it does ignite.

A chimney sweep will remove soot, creosote and any other blockages like bird nests from your flue. This

will mean that your fire will draw well, put out more heat, and will also reduce the likelihood of a chimney fire. He or she will also check your fire is properly installed, safe and well maintained so that it is ready for the colder months. This includes looking for splitting or corrosion of the seams, making sure the fire bricks are intact and that the baffles, air tubes and flue system are working properly.



DID YOU BUY YOUR WOOD EARLY?

A total of 108 households purchased fire wood under our Good Wood Burn Bright "Buy Your Wood Now" promotion run during November and December.

Buying your wood early is a great way of making sure you have dry seasoned wood for winter, and avoiding the rush in the colder months, when wood is more expensive and may not be ready for burning – it's also usually cheaper!

The winner of the free flue clean and woodburner check was Sue Christensen, of Atawhai. Sue purchased her load from Wholesale Firewood.
