Framing Our Future Youth Workshop (2.05pm – 3.05pm)

In our future we will see:

1. Environment - biodiversity - health:

- **In Nelson 2060, we want turtles and panda; to wake up to birds chirping; fish stocks not depleted**
- **To have a sustainable environment that can support us in means of energy; native fauna and flora should be an important aspect**
- **Clean air/ water; recycle-reuse**
- **In Nelson 2060, we want recycling to have a bigger effect on people i.e. recycling is the main waste management; we want no rubbish in the sea, but still have landfill for products that can't be reduced, reused or recycled; the recycling system must be easy to use**
- **Consequences for pollution; increased native populations**
 - Healthy environment
 - Healthy biodiversity
 - Good biodiversity
 - Living organisms – food
 - Bio diverse back yards
 - Animal and plants
 - Lots of birds in the trees and fish in the water
 - Not lots of extinct species
 - Native the same as now; water, trees and whatnot
 - Healthy native animals/ plant populations
 - No change in the environment
 - Biodiversity of animal plants people
 - Many native plants and animals in our rivers and on land – enough water/ food/ land for everyone
 - Clean fresh healthy air
 - Animals need clean air for good health
 - Oxygen
 - Clean air – no pollution – healthy
 - Healthy kids – no asthma
 - Lungs still cranking – healthy workers – high oxygen air
 - Better care for waste and rubbish
 - Good alternatives to landfills
 - Good waste management system
 - Most rubbish being reused
 - Reduce – reuse- recycle
 - Recycling – waste dumps – central – resource use
 - More recycling – less recycling going into landfills – smaller carbon footprint
 - No rubbish around

2. Water:

- **Clean fresh - not having to worry about safety and cleanliness of it; supports animals, recreation, swimming, boating and fishing**
 - **In Nelson 2060, we want plenty of safe clean drinking water, clean rivers, beaches and other swimming areas**
 - Animals/ plants/ rivers/ land – cool; having enough water for everything – fresh clean
 - Clean water for healthy animals, plants, kids, grandkids
 - Clean fresh healthy water for everybody/ everything
 - Clean water for swimming
 - Good, unpolluted swimming holes
 - Clean beaches/ river banks
 - Rivers and beaches
 - Cool water – coral – life
 - Safe levels for marine life
 - Drinkable water – clean river water/ seawater for aquatic fauna
 - No polluted water – native fish in our streams
 - Clear cool, fresh flowing clean, drinkable - fish
 - Non-contaminated
 - Plenty of clean, safe, fresh drinking water
 - Fresh water – clean, healthy, treated
 - Still healthy streams – clean water
 - Not waste water – recycle

3. Cultural – Social wellbeing – Heritage - Luxuries – Entertainment – Sport and recreation

- **Same as today: health drugs, native heritage, recreation**
- **Outdoors still available to use; sports/ physical activities**
- **In Nelson 2060, we want places to visit that are still untouched; good variety of recreational opportunities, and thriving sport teams**
- **Still a thriving arts scene – facilities to be natural features, not big artificial areas – diverse population that is celebrated not discriminated**
- **In Nelson we want old heritage locations we can visit, and happy people**
 - Nayland College is still around
 - Preserve historical sites
 - Nelson's heritage/ culture
 - Want to be able to see Nelson's heritage – to see the culture still alive
 - I want to be able to show my ancestors places that I went to as a younger person

- Alcohol- clubs – pubs – internet – electronics – sports – motor cross
- Want to still have plenty of recreation grounds
- Playgrounds
- Good rugby team at Nayland – preserve parks & sporting areas
- Snow to ski on
- Old people's parks
- Place to lay croquet and bingo
- Able Tasman still looks good
- Good national parks
- Not mining national parks
- Still able to swim in rivers oceans beaches

4. Population/ Urban Design:

- **In Nelson 2060, we want a not- over populated area, plenty of space for housing, recreational areas, other new facilities for young people, good public transport system, recycling**
 - Plenty of space for housing / recreational areas
 - Facilities to keep young people here e.g. university
 - More variety in ages
 - 17-18year olds
 - Good public transport
 - Not over populated
 - More teenagers and young adults, so they can look after us
 - Young people to look after the oldies – not just a giant rest home

5. Food:

- **Cheap, safe, same foods as today; sustainable wild foods**
- **Healthy, fresh, locally/ home grown/ caught, with food labelling**
- **In Nelson 2060, we want to be eating the same food we have now, that is locally grown, non-processed and variety**
 - Same food – healthy but good
 - Cheap, healthy, nice, fresh, same types

- Want to be able to feed my children with healthy food – keep fuel usage low
- Transport of food is electric
- Beer, tea, coffee
- Food to eat
- Fine delicacies like wine and blue cheese

6. Transport:

- **Easy access, cheap public transport, maybe even free**
- **Electric powered/ sustainably powered; same power output from cars; more public transport; more frequent**
 - Better public transport
 - Public transport
 - Need a form of personal transport
 - Still be able to travel around with no trouble
 - Easy way to get around
 - Bus/ plane/ cars/ trains/ HiLux/ motorbike
 - Fit
 - Mobility scooter - slammed on 20's, pod filter, turbo big bore
 - Monorail
 - Environmentally friendly alternatives for fuel
 - Reusable power/ energy
 - Wind/ solar/ power plants
 - Less fuel emissions, so foods can be cheap, so we can eat
 - Keep fuel usage lower, not higher

7. Energy:

- **Cook Strait hydro scheme; solar panels in sunny places**
- **In Nelson 2060, we want energy efficient ways of living; we want alternative fuels to fossil fuels – reduce the amount of fossil fuels we use; use natural resources as a means of energy i.e. wind, solar and bio-diesel**
 - Solar power – batteries – efficiency
 - Alternative electricity, such as solar panels and wind turbines

8. Economy – Economic development

- **In Nelson 2060, we want to have plenty of jobs available, to be able to have an economy with lots of money, to be able to sustain the population**
 - **Good economy that can afford the things the public needs**
 - **Affordable; flexible jobs; good education schemes**
 - Rich
 - Need jobs available with good income
 - Good economy to be able to import goods
 - Want more options for youth to help with extending community
 - To be able to afford things – will NZ still be worth anything?
 - Financial security
 - Plenty of jobs available
 - Strong economy in Nelson

9. Air:

- **Clean, pure**
 - **In Nelson we want clean non-polluted safe-levelled breathable air**
 - Breathable – clean
 - Air I can breath
 - Clear, clean for workers/ staff/ kids
 - Air that is clean and healthy
