



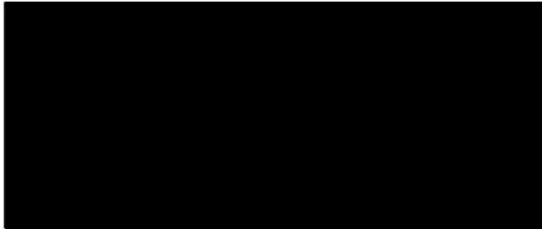

OFFICIAL INFORMATION REQUEST REGARDING SPEED BUMPS.

I refer to your official information request dated 21 March 2023 regarding speed control devices installed on Bisley Ave, Moana Ave and Princes Drive.

The information you requested is enclosed.

Q1) Who is accountable for the decision to install

Residents and the Police have raised concerns over speed on the Port Hills over a number of years. Following successful results using speed control measures on Stansell Avenue, Tosswill Road and Chamberlain Street in 2023, an operational decision was made to trial speed control measures on Bisley and Moana Avenues and Princes Drive. These were based on advice from engineers regarding best practice for speed control.

Q2) A full breakdown of cost to install

The contract price for Bisley and Moana Avenues was \$62,939 (plus GST) payable as one lump sum on completion. This included

- Traffic management and planning
- Key in of cushions up to 100mm
- Membrane coat seal via trailer sprayer CRS2 emulsion
- Speed cushions Asphalt DG10 or DG7
- Triangle Line markings
- Installation of speed hump signs
- Polymer Modified Bandage

The cost of Princes Drive was \$62,247 (plus GST). Breakdown:

- Polymer Modified Bandage \$3680
- Temporary Traffic Management \$11,550
- Supply and install speed cushions (8) \$8,640
- Construct full width Watts Profile hump (3) \$22,678
- Additional work including kerb grinding/ tactile/man hole lifting \$15,698

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Q3) The calculated delay in response time to emergency services

This has not been calculated but is considered negligible. Emergency vehicles (fire and ambulance) are able to straddle speed cushions.

Q4) Who provided the funding

Funding for this safety work is from the general roading budget which funded from rates and attracts a 51% subsidy from central government through the National Land Transport Fund.
