

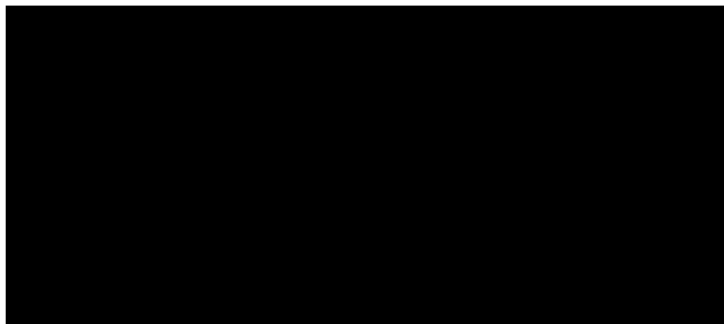

OFFICIAL INFORMATION REQUEST - CROSSINGS ON NELSON ROADS

I refer to your official information request dated 14 March 2025 regarding installation of raised pedestrian crossings and zebra crossing in Nelson. Each part of your request is reproduced in bold, with responses below each one.

In order to provide you with context in terms of the information you have requested, we note that the events and data you have requested spans over thirty years and as such we have made our best efforts to provide an accurate response.

When did you build your first raised pedestrian crossing, and why?

Our records indicate that the first courtesy crossings (raised pedestrian crossings) were likely installed in the early 1990s. These raised pedestrian crossings were installed to replace the previous traffic lights at this intersection.

How many have you built since?

Our records show a total of 119 raised pedestrian crossings, this also includes courtesy crossings.

In the past five years, how many pedestrians have been injured on traditional zebra crossings in your area?

The NZTA Crash Analysis system (CAS), indicates four pedestrian incidents occurred at these crossings between 2020 and 2024.

In the past five years, how many pedestrians have been injured on raised pedestrian crossings in your area?

The NZTA Crash Analysis system (CAS), indicates six pedestrian incidents occurred at these crossings between 2020 and 2024.
